Each year, as many as 35,000 people return to Philadelphia from incarceration, often struggling with the same question: "What now?" Returning citizens face a lifetime of barriers, but the first few days and weeks are particularly daunting. They are released from prison with questions about where they are going to live, how they might support themselves, and where they might find help. This is why Redemption Housing's first residential program, Barnabas House, is of such great importance. A reentry home in the heart of West Philadelphia, Barnabas House will exist to invite returning citizens back into the community, providing its residents with the support circles they need to properly break free of crime, addiction, and homelessness.



On September 22, 2018, Redemption Housing is partnering with fellow reentry service providers for its second annual DAY ONE CHALLENGE. This two-hour immersion experience will place approximately 150 community members and activists "in the shoes" of Philadelphia's returning citizens, providing a glimpse of what they have to experience in the days and weeks following their release. Participants of the DAY ONE CHALLENGE will work together to locate supports in employment and education, obtain their state IDs, and find a place to sleep until they can "get back on their feet." Upon completion, they will have a greater understanding of the challenges that await returning citizens and a greater appreciation for the variety of supports offered by Philadelphia's reentry service providers.

At the conclusion of the event, participants will gather at a Center City location with Redemption Housing's leadership, partnering organizations, and event sponsors for food, drink, and reflection.



# THE HARSH REALITIES OF RETURNING CITIZENS

Meet John, a lifelong Philadelphian. John completed his ten-year prison sentence last week, and with only the clothes on his back and a paper bag carrying his few personal belongings, John walked to the train station to purchase a ticket "home."

## JOHN: A TYPICAL RETURNING CITIZEN IN PHILADELPHIA

As a typical returning citizen in Philadelphia—an unmarried, thirty-year-old, African-American male—John will face several barriers in his efforts toward restoration. His family will hesitate to rekindle their relationships with him. It will be tough for John to locate safe, secure, and

affordable housing, and employers will be cautious about hiring him. In fact, a recent study of prisoner reentry in Philadelphia concludes: "At a time when more prisoners than ever are returning home...the challenges of prisoner reentry, the barriers faced by [returning citizens] appear to be growing."

One of the first choices that John must make as a free person is whether to spend his evenings on the streets or at the local homeless shelter. Having been released from prison with no one to receive him, John is facing hardships that are shared by many others. While he could probably find a couch to sleep on for a few days, he cannot think of any long-term prospects for stable housing.

John spends the last of his money on dinner as he walks to the shelter. As John lays restless on his cot, he plans out his activities for the next morning.





He knows that public housing will not be an option; it is official policy that people with violent histories or drug convictions are to be denied service by the housing authority. A number of local organizations are already making a difference for people like John in educating neighbors, advocating for change, and preparing returning citizens for the roadblocks ahead.

But few, if any, organizations offer a comfortable place to stay for those returning citizens who find themselves to be homeless. As hopelessness begins to overcome John, he passes out from exhaustion.



# AN INTRODUCTION TO BARNABAS HOUSE

Redemption Housing is currently working to purchase a West Philadelphia property to serve as the location of Barnabas House, a reentry home specifically designed for returning citizens like John. Barnabas House will be the ministry's flagship program, seeking to address recidivism in treating residents with the dignity, compassion, and attention they deserve.

According to a nationwide study in 2005, more than a third of returning citizens who are arrested within five years of their release are arrested within the first six months, with more than half arrested by the end of the first year. There is a great need for safe and supportive communities where returning citizens can develop the support circles they need to properly break free of crime, addiction, and homelessness.





We believe that Barnabas House will become a model for churches and faith-based community organizations connecting with Philadelphia's often abandoned population of returning citizens.

The residence will be supervised by a team of people who are committed to:

- Affirming the humanity of residents.
- Creating a comfortable home.
- Encouraging participation in a faithcentered community life.

The program and facilities will also include the following advantages:

- Private and shared rooms.
- Walking distance to public transportation.
- A community room for group meetings and services, such as on-site addiction recovery meetings, individual counseling, job skills training, and spiritual counseling.
